Federal Court sides with conservation groups over the Canadian government's failure to protect at-risk birds' habitat

Chief Justice Crampton found that Minister Steven Guilbeault's interpretation of the Species at Risk Act was unreasonable

VANCOUVER/UNCEDED x^wməθk^wəy^əm (MUSQUEAM), Skwxwú7mesh (SQUAMISH) AND səlilwətəɪ (TSLEIL-WAUTUTH) TERRITORIES – A Federal Court Justice has ruled in favour of conservation groups that challenged the federal Environment Minister for failing to take action to protect the critical habitats of at-risk migratory birds across the country. Conservation group buys out hunting rights in B.C. rainforest to protect wildlife

VICTORIA — A British Columbia conservation group says it has purchased exclusive hunting rights to a quarter of the Great Bear Rainforest on the province's north and central coast to protect wildlife there.

The Raincoast Conservation Foundation says it took two years to raise \$1.92 million to buy the 18,000-square-kilometre tenure off commercial hunting operators. [READ MORE](#)
